

oys & Girls Clubs of Northeast Ohio was formed in 2019 by the merger of Clubs in Cleveland, Akron, Lorain County and Sandusky. BGCNEO is one of the largest Boys & Girls Club organizations in the nation.

Clubs provide **safe, fun places** for kids ages 6-18 to go after school, with a focus on academic success, healthy lifestyles and character development. A few key facts:

- > We have **49 Clubs in six Northeast Ohio counties** and serve two more sites in Scioto
  County in an advisory capacity.
- In 2023, we had an average daily attendance of 2,200 and **nearly 10,000 total members**.
- > There is no charge to join a Club.
- > We are funded by a mix of grants, government funds and philanthropic dollars from individuals and corporations.
- Kids receive a free daily meal and get help from caring adult mentors.

## Club programs built on strong foundation

Programs at BGCNEO focus on three areas:

- Academic success: First activity of the day is Power Hour, when kids can do homework and get help from staff members. Ready Readers Plus helps younger members improve skills.
- > Healthy lifestyles: Sports, good nutrition and social-emotional health. Triple Play activities engage the mind, body and soul.
- Character development and leadership:
  Keystone and Torch Clubs are leadership
  groups. Youth of the Year program honors
  teens who excel in the Club and community.

Clubs work. In a Harris survey, 54% of alumni said the Club "**saved my life**." The 2-7 p.m. weekday hours are when kids are most at risk to become victims of crime or to get into trouble. That's when our doors are open.

## **BGCNEO** in Lorain County

- > 20 Clubs in the county including 13 in Lorain, three in Elyria, two in Wellington and two in Sheffield-Sheffield Lake.
- > First Boys & Girls Club in Lorain County opened in Oberlin in 1999.
- On an average day, **965** kids come to our Lorain County Clubs.
- > Child-poverty rate in the county is 19.2%.
